Raby works in the Educational Leadership and Policy Studies Department at California State University, Northridge and is also the director of California Colleges for International Education, a non-profit, educational consortium. She has studied community college internationalization for more than 40 years, authoring 15 books and holding senior editorial positions with three separate higher education journals.

Raby’s and Owczarek’s terms began on January 1. ECE board membership is a voluntary role designed to elevate the organization’s growing charitable and global education initiatives. Board members typically serve three-year terms and may serve up to six consecutive years.
