RECIPIENTS:

668 completed evaluation reports in 2025!

In 2025 ECE Aid™ recipients were educated in Afghanistan, Australia, Belarus, Brazil, Burundi, Cameroon, Chad, China, Colombia, Cuba, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Egypt, El Salvador, Ethiopia, France, Germany, Ghana, Guatemala, Haiti, India, Iran, Jamaica, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Kyrgyzstan, Lebanon, Libya, Marshall Islands, Mexico, Morocco, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, Russia, Rwanda, Spain, Sudan, Tanzania, Tunisia, Türkiye, Ukraine, United Kingdom, Venezuela, Vietnam, Zambia, and Zimbabwe.

The top three countries of education were Afghanistan, Ukraine, and Nigeria.

35 new ECE Aid™ participating institutions & organizations joined the program in 2025 to send referrals for fee waivers.

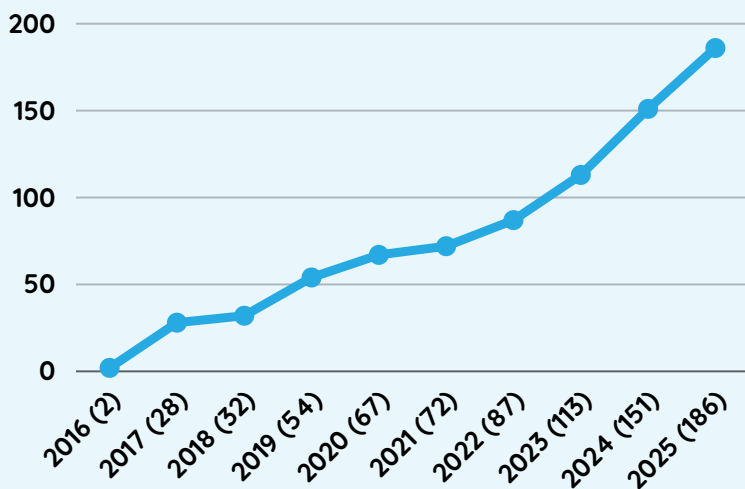

Guidelines for fee waiver eligibility include, but are not limited to, Temporary Protected Status (TPS), refugee or asylum status, special immigrant status, extreme hardship, or general lack of funds/scholarships due to unavoidable circumstances.

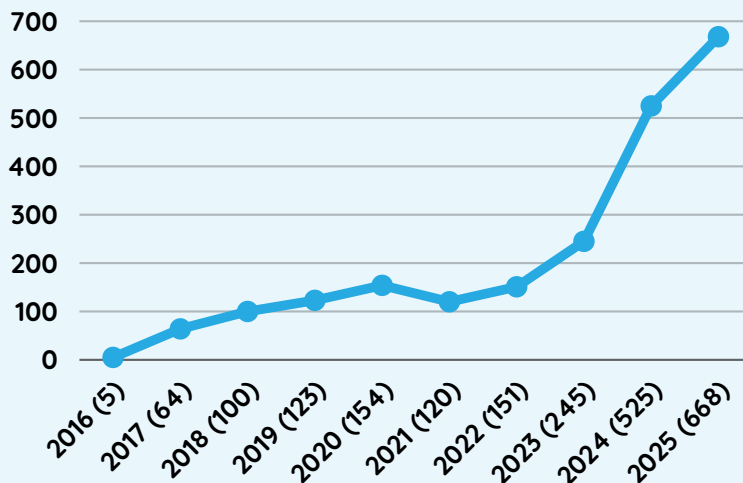
